

Fear Is Mounting For Safety Of Missing Newport Mother; Police Search Is Broadened

Police of Kentucky and neighboring states widened their search yesterday for an attractive Newport mother who mysteriously disappeared from her home last December 29.

Fears mounted that Mrs. Marcia Jean Arand Nolan, 20, 521 Lexington Ave., mother of a five-month-old daughter, may have met with violence.

Miss Helen Arand, 545 E. Third St., Newport, aunt of the missing girl, appealed yesterday to Guthrie F. Crowe, State Police Commissioner, to help locate Mrs. Nolan. "We are frantic and anything you can do or suggest that we do will be appreciated," Miss Arand said.

Police reported that Mrs. Nolan attended a party with her husband, Patrick, at a friend's home on the eve of her disappearance. Shortly after midnight the couple went home, where Mrs. Nolan put their daughter, Sharon, to bed. Saying she would return to the party, Mrs. Nolan left the house and has not been seen since.

Commissioner Crowe said a state-wide radio message has been sent to all his men. He added that information about the missing young woman was contained in a bulletin dispatched to all police

agencies in Kentucky and surrounding states.

Miss Arand said "We do not know whether she met with foul play, has amnesia or left on her own accord." She added that before disappearing Mrs. Nolan had "appeared worried."

Mrs. Nolan was described as being 5 feet 6 inches tall, weighing 105 pounds and having blond hair and blue eyes.
